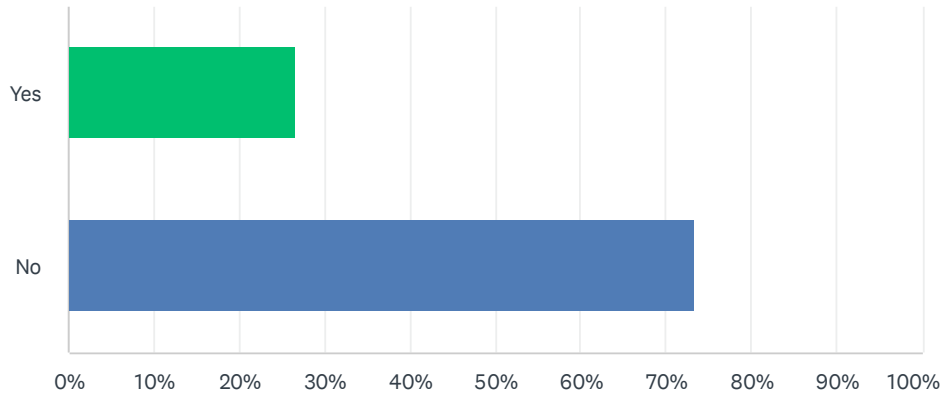


Q1 Is your organization willing to let MAs and RNs work from home as a retention tool?
